# **Looking Back**

Deputy Sheriff Scott Fague joined us at our January meeting to discuss active shooter and other life-threatening events, his emphasis being on situational awareness. Be observant. Stay aware of your surroundings. Know escape routes. If you sense that something is not right, leave the area. Most bad situations can be avoided if you remain alert and aware and remove yourself from a potentially threatening situation. The mantra for active shooters is Run, Hide, Fight. If you feel someone is a threat, leave. If you cannot leave, hide. If you can neither leave nor hide and your life is in danger, your last resort is to fight.

# **Making Plans - Weather**

Camano's greatest risk concerning disasters is severe weather. Understanding weather can help you become better prepared.

Information for this portion of our newsletter comes from NW Meteorologist Ted Buehner; from NOAA; from the National Weather Service; and from Island County Dept. of Emergency Management.

According to Ted Buehner's North Sound Weather Minute, our last significant rainfall for the month was January 10th with the remainder of the month leading us into a ranking in the top five of driest Januarys on record. The reason for this is a buckling of the weather systems that generally drive more moisture into our region providing rain in the lowlands and snow in the mountains. This buckling has shifted the system north into Alaska and the Yukon, leaving a high-pressure system setting just off the PNW Coast while also surging more frigid conditions into the central and eastern part of the nation. This pattern is finally breaking down. The outlook for February is more active weather with a sweep of colder, moisture laden air from Canada, potentially resulting in lowland snow.

# Planning Ahead for February

For those of you who are new to our newsletter, this segment allows for an ongoing look at spreading the cost of preparedness out over the months rather than trying to acquire everything all at once. Also included are measures you can take to prepare for any emergency/disaster. For those of

you with the opportunity to review your supplies and your plans.

#### Items to locate or purchase

Compass Local map

Toothpaste and toothbrush

Denture products Liquid soap

Cleansing wipes Hand sanitizer

#### **Actions to take:**

Verify that your out-of-area emergency contact information is up to date. Share any changes with all family and friends who may wish to check on your well-being when local communications are out.

Collect and store your favorite herbs and seasonings in small packets. Date all perishables Remove expired items.

Hold neighborhood disaster exercises. Imagine the following scenarios:

A major storm has made roads impassable and knocked out power, likely for several days.

A major earthquake has hit the area. Roads are gone and power, phone lines, and internet are knocked out. First responders may not be able to reach your neighborhood for days. Outside assistance with food and water may take even longer.

What items will you need for your household and as a neighborhood for each of these scenarios? What actions are you likely to need to take to assist others in your neighborhood? How best can you help one another?
