Weather

Camano's greatest risk for a disaster is severe weather. Understanding weather can help you become better prepared.

Information for this portion of our newsletter comes from NW Meteorologist Ted Buehner; from NOAA; from the National Weather Service; from Island County Department of Emergency Management; and from the Climate Prediction Center.

NOAA is restating its winter forecast for the PNW with a weak La Niña pattern bringing cooler and wetter weather than is normal for our area. They emphasize that this is a weak system, meaning that the impacts are not expected to be overly dramatic. That does not rule out more wind and heavy rains, however, should the atmospheric river shift north, once more. According to Bill Deger, AccuWeather senior meteorologist, parts of the PNW and southwestern Canada can see more rain and flood risk through the end of January as a result of a parade of storms associated with the atmospheric river. The heaviest precipitation is likely to be over the Olympic Mountains and Vancouver Island.

Note that, as oceans continue to warm, atmospheric river conditions will strengthen. This can lead to increased frequency and intensity in coming seasons. The impacts include the potential redistribution of the global water supply, and reduced habitat and affected breeding cycles for fish and other organisms in lakes where the loss of oxygen is occurring faster than expected. For us, it can mean stronger storms hitting our area.

Planning Ahead for January

For those who are new to this newsletter, this segment allows for an ongoing look at spreading the cost of preparedness supplies over a year rather than trying to acquire everything all at once. Also included are measures you can take to prepare for any emergency/disaster. For those who have been receiving our newsletter, it provides the opportunity to review and update your supplies and plans.

Items to locate or purchase

Hard hat	Goggles
Work gloves	N95 mask
Heavy shoes & socks	Whistle
Reflective vest	Flashlight/light sticks
Extra batteries	Help/Okay signs with tape or pins

Actions to take

Provide the above apparel, whistle, and flashlights/light sticks to be stored under or near the bed for each member of the household. Should a disaster strike late at night, these items will help you make your way safely out of your residence. If you are unable to evacuate your home, the whistle can guide rescuers to your location. If you need assistance, post a HELP sign in the most noticeable window. If you are safe and heading toward your neighborhood gathering site, post the OK sign in the window.

Work with your neighbors to organize your neighborhood under the CPG's Neighborhood Ready program. Know the first steps to take in the first seconds and minutes following a disaster.
